Overview of the FPH licensing & approvals transition process



- Numerous inter-agency working groups in place to cover floodplain harvesting processes from end to end – with these working groups looking at assessments and approvals, billing, system changes, together with metering and measurement
- Handover of all relevant information and records including ROI data, in-eligible work data, details of works on lands which do not have lawful occupation, details of works which require a flood work approval and all records associated with licences and approvals
- Staged implementation and support during and post transition

Floodplain harvesting water supply work approvals



- DPE Water Licensing & Approval team have assessed and will determine and grant FPH water supply work approvals across the 5 northern Murray-Darling Basin valleys.
 - Approvals are then transferred across to WaterNSW to process any future approval amendments or dealings.
 - This includes 485 water supply work approvals, covering 6,890 individual works
- WaterNSW future workload will include receipt, assessment and determination of applications to amend their FPH water supply work approvals.
 - To include works on Crown Land once lawful occupation has been obtained.
 - To include a change to approved work/s.
 - To include water supply works which require a Flood Work Approval.

This guide is for the application for water supply work approvals and water use approvals. Water supply work approval authorise a holder to construct and use a specified water supply work. Water use approvals authorise a holder to use water for a particular purpose, such as irrigation.

INTRODUCTION
This guide is provided to assist you in completing the Application for approval for water supply works, water use or water supply work approval or water use approval under section 92 of the Water Management Act 2000 (WMA) or to apply to change or remove a condition of an existing water use or water supply work approval.

A water supply works approval allows you to build and operate a particular pump, bore or other water management work at a particular location. A water use approval allows you to use water for a particular purpose at a particular location (B) and this form only if you want approval to use water for irrigation or town water supply. It is important to note that water use or water supply works approval do not allow you to take water without a water access licence (WAL).

If you want to apply for approval for water supply works and water use on different properties, you will need to make separate applications. You should also refer to information on Designing to water and Applying for a new water access licence on the WaterNSW website, which provides more information on water designs.

ABOUT THIS GUIDANCE
The Application for approval for water supply works, and/or water use has several parts (relating to the type of approval sought) and sections, which are identified in some of the questions.

The questions are identified by a number on the left hand side of the page, for example, 8c, which is section 8, section 8.

This guide provides detailed explanations of each section and questions to help you fill in the application form. We recommend you read this carefully before completing the application form. However, if you require further assistance, please contact WaterNSW.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS
To make sure that your application is processed efficiently, please note these general instructions:

- Use BLOCK letters on this use water to read.
- If there is not enough space on the form for all your information complete the reverse or a separate sheet of paper and attach it to application form (numbered to include the page when numbering your pages).
- Answer the pages when numbering your pages.
- The information is necessary to verify and process your application - if this is not approved if the information is not available for the assessment?

How to answer questions in the application form

The application form has a number of sections. In each section are questions identified by a number on the left hand side of the form (for example 34-4 question 4 in section B). The information provided in the guide corresponds to these numbers in the application form. Ensure you provide all the information requested in this application form. If your application form is incomplete it will not be accepted. WaterNSW may contact you to request further information in relation to your application.

How to complete and submit your application form

There are two options for completing this form – you can either: complete a 'fillable' PDF form or print the form and fill it out by hand in capital letters with a black/blue pen.

The completed form must be signed by all approved parties. There are two options for submitting your completed and signed application form – you can either:

- email the completed and signed application form to Customer.Helpdesk@waternew.com.au. A reply will be emailed to you informing you that your email has been received and forwarded to the relevant WaterNSW Assessments and Approvals team member.

Floodplain Harvesting Water Access Licences

- In addition to the grant of a Floodplain Harvesting Water Supply Work Approval, a Floodplain Harvesting Water Access Licence will also be granted.
- Dealings are permitted subject to the trade rules that are water source specific and set out in the relevant water sharing plans.
- Some common dealing transactions may include:-
 - **71W** – nomination of works ie. remove a nominated water supply work approval from FPH Water Access Licence
 - **71P** – subdividing of a FPH Water Access Licence into two or more access licences, or the consolidation of two or more access licences into a single access licence
 - **71Q** – assignment of share components (permanent trade)
- No temporary trading of allocations (71T)

Application to subdivide, or to subdivide and change a water access licence

This application form should be used to:

- subdivide a water access licence (WAL) under section 71P (1) (a) of the *Water Management Act 2000* (the Act)
- subdivide a WAL under section 71P (1) (a) of the Act and change one or more of the new WALs.

Subdivision means the cancellation of a WAL and creation of two or more new WALs. The 'change' to one or more new WALs may relate to any of the following:

- conversion to a new category/ subcategory of WAL (under section 71O of the Act);
- amendment of the share component of a WAL, to specify a different water source/ water management area (under section 71R of the Act);
- amendment of the extraction component of a WAL, to vary the times, rates or circumstances with respect to the taking of water under the WAL, or to vary the areas or locations (e.g. zone/ sub-zone) as the areas or locations from which water may be taken under the WAL (under section 71S of the Act);
- add or remove a nominated water supply work (also applicable to intrastate and inter-state tagging) (under section 71W of the Act).

If you wish to change a WAL without subdivision, use the application form *Application to change a water access licence*. If you intend to make any other types of changes to your WAL, you will need to complete a different application form.

Important note

Any subsequent transfer of subdivided licences, including transfer to a different combination of existing holders may have tax implications. You are encouraged to seek your own independent advice regarding any potential tax liability that may arise.

- The NSW Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) determines how much WaterNSW can charge for the water services we provide.
- IPART have determined floodplain harvesting charges, which WaterNSW has communicated to our customers via our pricing booklet.
