Opening water allocations for Hastings Valley water users

The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment today announced the available water determinations for Hastings Valley water users for the new 2019-20 water year, commencing 1 July 2019.

Domestic and stock, local water utility, unregulated river and aquifer water access licence holders who draw from the Camden Haven River, Ellenborough River, Forbes River, Maria River, Middle Hastings River, Pappinbarra River, Stewarts River, Thone River, Upper Hastings River, Wilson River, Kindee Creek, Limeburners Creek, Mortons Creek, Queens Lake, Watson Taylors Lake, Lake Innes and Coastal Hastings water sources receive an allocation of 200 per cent of entitlement or 2 megalitres per unit share, in line with the rules for the commencement of the new Hastings unregulated and alluvial water sharing plan.

Domestic and stock, local water utility and aquifer water access licence holders who draw from the Hastings River coastal floodplain alluvial groundwater source receive an allocation of 100 per cent or 1 megalitre per unit share of entitlement.
