Opening water allocations for Lower North Coast users

The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment today announced available water determinations for Lower North Coast water users for the new 2019-20 water year, commencing 1 July 2019.

Domestic and stock, local water utility and major water utility water access licence holders receive an allocation of 100 per cent.

All surface water access licence holders on the Avon, Lower and Upper Barrington, Bowman, Lower and Upper Gloucester, Copplacurripa, Lower and Upper Barnard, Lower, Mid and Upper Manning, Nowendoc, Rowleys, Myall, Coolongolook, Wallamba and Karuah rivers receive an allocation of 100 per cent or 1 megalitre per unit share of entitlement.

Surface water access licence holders, who draw water from Dingo and Myall creeks, together with the Manning estuary tributaries, will also receive an allocation of 100 per cent or 1 megalitre per unit share of their entitlement.

Aquifer water access licence holders covered by the Lower North Coast unregulated and alluvial water sharing plan receive 1 megalitre per unit share of entitlement.

Licence holders who access water from sources not covered by a water sharing plan are allocated full entitlement unless otherwise advised.
