### Compliance with water management principles -Water Sharing Plan for the NSW Murray Darling Basin Fractured Rock Groundwater Sources Amendment Order 2021

This document details how the department has complied with the water management principles outlined in the Water Management Act 2000 in the developing the Water Sharing Plan for the NSW Murray Darling Fractured Rock Groundwater Sources Amendment Order 2021.

### Background

When making or concurring to the making of the amendment of the *Water Sharing Plan for the NSW MDB Fractured Rock Groundwater Sources 2020* (the Plan), Ministers have a duty under section 9(1) of the *Water Management Act 2000* (the Act):

- (a) to take all reasonable steps to do so in accordance with, and so as to promote, the water management principles of the Act, and
- (b) as between the principles for water sharing set out in section 5(3) of the Act, to give priority to those principles in the order in which they are set out in that subsection.

The water management principles that are set out in section 5(3) provide that in relation to water sharing:

- (a) sharing of water from a water source must protect the water source and its dependent ecosystems, and
- (b) sharing of water from a water source must protect basic landholder rights, and
- (c) sharing or extraction of water under any other right must not prejudice the principles set out in paragraphs (a) and (b).

### This amendment

This amendment provides increased protection to groundwater-dependent ecosystems by:

- (a) adding seven high priority groundwater-dependent ecosystems to Schedule 2
- (b) amending the high priority groundwater-dependent ecosystem map to include high priority ecosystems for the Peel Fractured Rock Water Source.

The other changes included in this amendment order do not have an impact on the way in which the Plan promotes Water Management Act principles. They improve clarity in interpreting maps and water source descriptions ensuring new works are assigned to the correct groundwater source.

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This amendment promotes the water management principles set out in the Act, as detailed in the table below:
