- Water Infrastructure NSW
- 1 July 2021
- Department of Planning, Industry and Environment
- WaterNSW involved as owner and operator of Wyangala Dam



# Our project

## Key benefits

- Increase storage capacity of the dam by 53%
- Significantly improves:
  - Drought resilience
  - Water reliability
  - Flood attenuation
- Increases capability to manage high inflow/flood events

# Water Treatment Plant

- Clean drinking water for Wyangala Village and Wyangala Waters Holiday Park
- Enviropacific Services appointed to build and commission the plant
- Planning approval pathway
- Construction expected to start late 2021
- Commissioning followed by clean drinking water



# Wyangala Waters progress

- Working with Reflections Holiday Parks
- Inundation level
- MISL to be confirmed
- Potential precinct areas for relocations options
- Connection to clean drinking water, electricity and sewage.
